Previous ArtsCAMP participant makes their creative mark in Perth's cultural scene.

ArtsCAMP is Propel Youth Arts WA's inaugural camp designed to provide young people the opportunity to learn about cultural experiences Perth has to offer and meet like-minded creative people. Registrations have now been extended and close Friday 20th May 2011.

Now in its third year, ArtsCAMP is proving to be a stepping - stone for young people wanting to start their careers in the creative industries. Local Wandi resident Jack Hall has already started his music career as the lead guitarist in the band Hey Hurricane. The band features on the Triple J Unearthed website and won first prize at the City of Cockburn Battle of the Bands in December last year. Most recently, the Hey Hurricanes played live at the Own It! National Youth Week KickstART Youth Markets. The band is set to have their songs produced by the Tea Party front man Jeff Martin.



Propel Youth Arts WA Executive Director Monique Douglas said the program has been well received over the past few years and it was extremely rewarding to see the fruition of the young people's artistic careers.

"ArtsCAMP has been invaluable in encouraging young people to start their dream career in the arts. Like Jack, many previous ArtsCAMP participants have since been involved in visual arts exhibitions, markets and even formed a band registered on the Triple J Unearthed website," she said.

"Other participants have undertaken formal training at universities and TAFE institutions, volunteered at art events throughout Perth and started their own creative collectives. It is very exciting to see these talented young people embrace the opportunities offered from ArtsCAMP."

Proudly supported by the Foundation for Young Australians, this years ArtsCAMP will include creative workshops with local artists, tours of metropolitan arts companies and organisations, creative industry and career information forums and opportunities to attend gigs, theatre shows and exhibitions. Participants will be exposed to many art forms including contemporary dance, opera, theatre, circus, film, contemporary music and more.
