WA Youth Theatre Company in collaboration with West Australian Opera are calling for expressions of interest from young WA theatre directors and designers to participate in one of two 6-week masterclass series - **Directing for Opera** and **Designing for Opera**.

Masterclass participants will be familiarised with all aspects of directing and designing for professional opera. At the conclusion of each course participants will make a presentation of their vision for of WA Opera's production of *The Nightingale* by Imant Raminsh (October 2020, His Magesty's Theatre). From these presentations a director and a designer (or a collaborating team) will be selected for these paid positions on this main stage production under the mentorship of Brendan and Zoe.

Successful applicants will need to be able to commit to the full training course and rehearsal and production schedule.

You do not have to have previous opera direction or design experience to apply and you do not have to be able to read music (but it is advantageous).

About The Nightingale:

The Nightingale is an opera for young people, performed by young people, for all to enjoy. Based on the story by Hans Christian Andersen the opera tells of an Emperor of China who is enchanted by the singing of a nightingale in his garden.

The Emperor of China convinces the nightingale to sing for him but when the Emperor of Japan arrives with the gift of a mechanical nightingale, he becomes obsessed with his new toy and the real nightingale flies away. Struck down by illness and with his mechanical nightingale now broken, the Emperor begs the nightingale to return and sing for him again. She agrees, but on the condition that she is allowed to sing for all the people, both the high and low born.
